Year has been filled with accomplishments and progress

This is my final column for the Chamber's monthly newsletter. Our chamber is now under the very capable leadership of Mark Stautzenberger. We are fortunate to have someone with Mark's leadership skills and expertise. As a former mayor of Seguin, he also brings some insight to the job that will help the chamber work closely the SEDC, the city and others -- as we all try to increase the business opportunities available locally. Good luck Mark! You can call on me for help anytime.

The 2005-06 Chamber year seems like just a blur. I realize it has been 12 months, but it seems like just yesterday that Terry Boehnke was handing over gavel for the start of an amazing year. We've accomplished a great deal over the past year. The Chamber took the lead role when it came to working promote the Destination Seguin Bond Package approved by voters in May. The \$14.15 million package is a major win for Seguin. The Destination Seguin improvements will be good for everyone. Tourists, longtime residents and business owners will all benefit from the projects that are designed to make Seguin more of a destination for visitors. The projects, of course, are also designed to improve the overall quality of life of all Seguinians.

During this year, we also completed two of our other major goals. We partnered with the city of Seguin and Guadalupe County to join the Guadalupe Basin Coalition. This is a group of cities, counties, chambers of commerce and landowners who are fighting for the water rights of people living along the Guadalupe River. The coalition is designed to level the playing field with San Antonio, which has not historically been a good neighbor when it comes to planning for the future water needs of this region. Water may be the most important issue facing this state, and Seguin and Guadalupe County now have another outlet of support. We need all the aid we can muster when it comes to protecting our water rights for future generations.

We also worked last year with officials at Seguin City Hall to start to begin to change the "gotcha" culture that some people believe exists in city government. The perception has been and to some degree still exists -- that it is difficult to build in

Seguin. A number of developers have shared stories with me personally about how they felt like they were not being treated fairly. In some cases, it appeared as if we were not fostering the kinds of relationships needed to continue the positive growth that we've experienced of late. I don't know if this is a perception problem, but city administrators say they are sensitive to this issue and they are working to make sure that a spirit of cooperation exists locally. We all want safe and attractive new developments in our community, but we must have reasonable guidelines that make this an attractive place to continue to build new homes or new businesses. The SEDC has done a magnificent job bringing in new industrial clients. We want that same level of cooperation extended to other developers who are looking to build new homes or businesses in Seguin. We've made some progress, and I'm sure we'll continue to make this even better in 2007.

I'm very excited about the future of Seguin. The kinds of opportunities facing Seguin right now come along only once a generation. We have a special chance to even further enhance what I believe to be the best city in Texas. I love Seguin and it's been my pleasure to serve as chamber chairman for the past year. Thanks to all of you who helped to make this a memorable year.
