Taste of Scotland & Northern Ireland Tour Itinerary

Saturday, Oct 6 Depart The United States

Depart your hometown and take an overnight flight across the Atlantic.

Sunday, Oct 7 Edinburgh Arrival

Your CIE Guide will welcome you to Scotland. Next, drive into St. Andrews where golf originated and embark on a sightseeing tour to see the highlights. See the famous Royal and Ancient Clubhouse and the British Golf Museum which tells the story of British golf from its origins through to the present day. Also view St. Andrews Castle, which was founded in 1200 as a fortress and home of the Bishop of St. Andrews and St. Andrews Cathedral, which was founded in 1160 and then consecrated in 1318.

Afterwards, enjoy some free time to do some browsing on your own. Next, drive to your Edinburgh hotel, check in and spend the afternoon free to relax, sightsee or shop.

Monday, Oct 8 Edinburgh Guided Tour

After breakfast, set off on a tour of Scotland's capital city. Start your sightseeing with a drive through the heart of the city along Princes Street, famous for its shops on one side and gardens on the other. See the 18th century New Town with its broad streets, spacious squares and elegant town houses. Next, drive along the Royal Mile and pass the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the official Scottish residence of Her Majesty, The Queen. Stop for a guided tour of the imposing Edinburgh Castle, perched high above the city on volcanic rock. Return to your hotel and enjoy some free time before a festive evening. Tonight head to a unique Scottish venue, for dinner followed by a traditional Scottish ceilidh, a night of lively music and dancing. (B, D)

Tuesday, Oct 9 Blair Atholl Distillery

Today, travel into Pitlochry to visit the Blair Atholl Distillery, where you will see the process of whisky production and sample the finished product at the end of the tour. Stop to visit Blair Castle, home of the Duke of Atholl. Take a tour of the castle and enjoy the fine collections of furniture, portraits, china and armor. Continue your journey into Inverness, check into your hotel and relax or freshen up before dinner at the hotel restaurant with your fellow travelers. (B, D)

Wednesday, Oct 10 Culloden Visitor Centre

This morning, travel into Culloden Moor to tour the Visitor Centre. Walk around the battlefield where, on April 16, 1746, British Government forces defeated the army of Prince Charles Edward Stuart in just one hour and ended hopes of restoring the Jacobite Stuarts to the British throne. Next, stop to visit the Clava Cairns, which have an atmosphere all of their own. These cairns give their name to a set of thirty monuments, which are distributed up and down the rivers around Inverness. Continue your drive into Fort Augustus and take a boat ride on Loch Ness, which will give you an opportunity to enjoy the lovely scenery and also look for the famous monster, "Nessie." Return to your hotel in Inverness in time for dinner. (B, D)

Thursday, Oct 11 Glencoe Visitor Centre

After a wholesome Scottish breakfast, drive through Fort William, continuing your journey and stopping to visit the Glencoe Visitor Centre to explore the landscape, wildlife and history of this special place. Also learn about the conservation issues that the Trust faces both past and future. Drive alongside the famous

Loch Lomond, renowned in song and also for unsurpassed beauty of the lake and mountains. Journey along into Glasgow, check into your hotel and enjoy the remainder of the afternoon and evening free for individual pursuits and dining options. (B)

Friday, Oct 12 Belfast Arrival

After breakfast, drive into Cairnryan and take a ferry ride across the narrow channel between Scotland and Ireland and into Belfast. Upon arrival, meet your CIE Tours driver/guide who will welcome you to Ireland and escort you and your luggage to your luxury motorcoach. Drive a short distance to your Belfast hotel, check in and relax or freshen up before an authentic Irish dinner at the hotel restaurant with your fellow travelers. (B, D)

Saturday, Oct 13 Belfast Guided Tour

Today, embark on a guided tour of Belfast to see the Albert Memorial, the Opera House and Crown Liquor Saloon. In Donegall Square view the imposing City Hall, completed in 1906. The richly decorated interior contains stained glass portraying Belfast's principal industries. In the Titanic Quarter, visit Titanic Belfast to embark on a journey through the life of the Titanic, from her conception in Belfast to her tragic end. Return to your hotel where the remainder of the afternoon and evening are free for individual pursuits and dining options. (B)

Sunday, Oct 14 Giants Causeway

After breakfast, stop to visit the Giant's Causeway, an impressive area of hexagonal columns formed over 60 million years ago by cooling lava which has given rise to many legends. Journey along through Ireland's green pastures and into Derry and join a local guide for a walking tour around Derry, the ancient city to see the Guildhall, St. Columb's Cathedral, the Diamond and the 16th century walls. Drive to your hotel in Donegal, check in and settle into your room. In the evening, join your group for an authentic Irish dinner at the hotel restaurant. (B, D)

Monday, Oct 15 Slieve League

This morning, enjoy a sightseeing tour around County Donegal, which is renowned for woolen production and tweeds. Stop to visit Slieve League Sea Cliffs, where the highest point reaches 1,972 feet making them the highest in Europe. The cliffs drop straight down to the wild Atlantic waves below and you will see marvelous vistas. Enjoy tea and fresh baked scones before returning to your hotel and enjoying the remainder of the day free for independent activities and dining options. (B)

Tuesday, Oct 16 Donegal To Drogheda

After a hearty Irish breakfast, travel through the rolling hills and rugged countryside of Ireland's green pastures and into Drogheda. Upon arrival, check into your hotel and relax or freshen up before a traditional Irish dinner at the hotel restaurant with your fellow travelers. (B, D)

Wednesday, Oct 17 Return To The United States

Transfer to Dublin Airport in good time to check in for your flight. You may do some last minute shopping at the duty free stores before boarding your aircraft and flying across the Atlantic Ocean back to the United States. (B)
