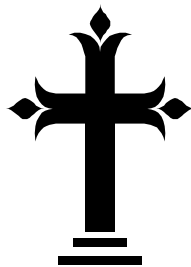

Jesus loved us this much!



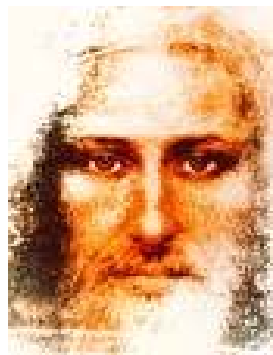

has only brought them disappointment. That is why the one week of camp is so very important to each and every child. They will leave with good memories that will prayerfully, give them a reason to hope again.

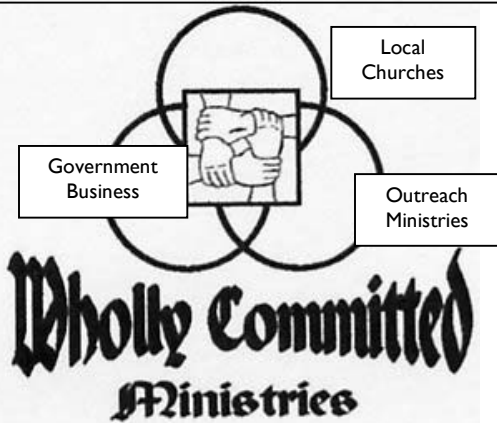
