

2013 DRC Half Marathon Turn by Turn Directions

Runners will start in Norbuck Park heading west.

After passing under Buckner Boulevard they will turn right on East Lawther Drive.

Runners will then take East Lawther Drive and turn left on new running trail going under Northwest Highway.

Just after passing under Northwest Highway runners will turn left on the new trail along Northwest Highway.

As the new trail nears West Lawther Drive runners turn left and again pass under Northwest Highway.

As soon as runners pass under Northwest they will veer right on the new trail heading up to West Lawther Drive. DO NOT CUT ACROSS GRASS TO GET TO WEST LAWATHER DRIVE.

Runners will follow West Lawther Drive to Branchfield Drive and turn right.

Runners will then take Branchfield Drive to Fisher Road and turn left.

Runners will then take Fisher Road to Greentree Lane and turn left.

Runners will then take Greentree Lane to Santa Barbara and turn left.

Runners will then take Santa Barbara to Sperry Street and turn right.

Runners will then take Sperry Street to Williamson Road and turn left.

Runners will then take Williamson Road to West Lawther Drive and turn right.

Runners will then follow West Lawther Drive to White Rock Road and go straight toward the Pump House.

Runners will follow White Rock Road past the Filter Building on to White Rock Lake Trail.

Runners will then U-turn from White Rock Lake Trail onto White Rock Creek Trail (the Veloway).

Runners will follow White Rock Creek Trail (the Veloway) past the spillway parking lot and veer left on to White Rock Lake Trail.

Runners will follow White Rock Lake Trail along Garland Road and veer left on the trail just before East Lawther Drive.

Runners will follow White Rock Lake Trail past the Arboretum and around Winfrey Point to Sunset Bay.

At Sunset Bay runners will follow the trail straight on to East Lawther Drive.

Runners will remain on East Lawther Drive past the Stone Tables Pavilion, the Bath House Cultural Center, and the Big Thicket on their way back to Norbuck Park.
