West – Czech Point of Central Texas

The town of West [pop. about 3000] is located in McLennan county, about 20 miles north of Waco and 80 miles south of Dallas, just east of I-35. First settled as the Anglo-American community of Bould Springs in the 1850's, West was established in 1881, with the arrival of the Missouri, Kansas, and Texas [Katy] Railroad. Czech and German settlers began arriving before 1900 and the town is very proud of its Czech heritage. Today the railroad tracks run parallel with Main Street, the main shopping center for the town.

I spent the night at Czech Inn in order to get an early start in the morning. The Inn is clean, quiet, and comfortable, and has a very helpful staff who will offer suggestions on their favorite places to eat in town.

At the suggestion of a local resident, I started the day with a great home-style breakfast at the Stockyards Café, located on the west access road just south of the Czech Inn . Then I headed into town and stopped at Gerik's Old Czech Bakery for another cup of coffee and a couple of their wonderful kolaches.

My first stop was City Hall to visit the Chamber of Commerce. I found the Chamber offices temporarily closed, but city staff members were full of information on things to see and do while I was in town.

My first stop on Main Street was Divine Designs, a flower and Christian gift shop filled with interesting items and the wonderful smell of fresh flowers. I also stopped by the Old Corner Drug Store which was doing a lively morning business.

The West Public Library, located on the south side of town, is nicely decorated and well-organized, and has a good selection of books for adults and children. The library is closed on Fridays and Sundays. There is a small but very interesting local history and Czech heritage display in the library and a nice genealogy/local history research room. Nancy, the librarian on the desk, is a member of the committee which is organizing the establishment of a new heritage and local history museum downtown and hopes it will be open within a year.

Nancy suggested St. Mary's Cemetery as an



interesting stop while in town. This large cemetery, located about 2 miles south of downtown West, was established in 1893 and contains the gravesites of early pioneers, immigrants,

veterans, and many members and clergy of St. Mary's Church of the Assumption in West. The earliest burials were dated 1892 and 1893. The large cemetery is beautifully maintained and the many carved marble and ornamental metal grave markers are fascinating. As with many of the Czech and German cemeteries, many markers display small portraits of the people buried there and are worded in the Czech language. This is a peaceful and quiet place, rich in the local cultural heritage.

There are many good places in town to eat lunch

or dinner, including Wild Bill's Outlaw Steakhouse, Pizza House, the Czech

American Restaurant, Nors Sausage and Burger House, and Leo's Mexican Café. I headed for Nors on



Main Street. One of their most recommended items is the **Sausage Burger on a jalapeño**-cheese bun. This burger is made with a ground sausage pattie and filled with fresh vegetables. For desert, I walked around the corner to The Village Bakery and sampled their kolaches. There are many great bakeries in West, including the famous Czech Stop, but this one was my favorite.

After lunch, I visited Olde Czech Corner Antiques on Main, which had been closed earlier in the day. This large store is filled with fascinating gifts, antiques, books, and decorative items for children's' rooms. Plan a extended stay here to see the items contained in a number of rooms. I also stopped by Czech Point Antiques, but found them open only later in the week. I've found it common in many smaller towns that specialty stores, such as antique malls, are only open later in the week [Thursday thru Saturday] after 1 pm.

Another attraction in town is the restored KATY



Depot, which is open during weekdays in the afternoon. I was greeted by Mr. Clark, who was born and raised in West and has recently "come home". He is a strong supporter of his town

and is a good source of information about West. The depot proudly houses the Wall of Honor, a memorial of pictures of the hundreds of men and women from West who have served in the military. The depot also houses many historical photographs of the people and notable events in West, including The Crash at Crush, a spectacular staged crash of two large locomotives near West in 1896.

Late in the afternoon I visited with Al Vanek, an enthusiastic supporter of West and one of the leaders in ideas to increase tourism. I was also introduced to local resident Nancy Vidrine, who took me on a tour of the First United Church, which I believe is the oldest existing church building in town. The building has original painted

cedar planks on the exterior and the unique details of the sanctuary include beautiful exposed beams with carved panels supporting the ceiling. The bright windows of hand-colored glass and

It is August 7, 1974, the night before President Richard Nixon announced his resignation as the shadow of impeachment loomed. He has summoned Secretary of State Henry Kissinger to the Lincoln Sitting Room and Kissinger arrives, expecting to find his President preparing to resign. But Nixon is in the process of wrestling with that very decision. Unstable, nostalgic, garrulous and paranoid, Nixon leads his Secretary of State on a journey through the high moments of his administration.

The journey borders on the surreal as Nixon pressures Kissinger into reenacting crucial scenes: Kissinger plays Nixon, Nixon plays Brezhnev, Kissinger plays Kennedy and Mao - the scenarios become dizzying! Meanwhile, Kissinger is subtly working to convince Nixon to step down so that he can pursue his geopolitical goals - and his own quest for historical glory - unencumbered by a weakened President. Nixon, however, can't face the lonely aftermath of such a decision; he envisions himself wandering some hellish golf course, waiting to die. As the evening and the drinking progress, the two concoct a plan to provoke an international crisis that would allow Nixon to leave office a hero.

Nixon's Nixon will play two weeks only in the Unity Studio, previewing on Thursday, October 25, opening on Friday, October 26, and playing through Sunday, November 4, 2012. Performances are Thursday at 7:30 p.m., Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 4 p.m. Tickets are \$25 and the Unity Studio is open seating and limited so reservations are strongly recommended.
