

## HISTORY OF THE CAROUSEL

FIREMEN'S PARK IS THE SIGHT FOR ONE OF ONLY SIX ORIGINAL ANTIQUE CAROUSELS IN THE WORLD. IN THE EARLY 1900's, A TRAVELING CARNIVAL CAME TO LEE COUNTY AND SET UP THEIR ATTRACTIONS AT THE FAIR GROUNDS (FIREMEN'S PARK). THE LOCAL POPULATION ENJOYED GOING OUT TO THE PARK TO EXPERIENCE THE THRILL OF THE ATTRACTIONS. THE LOCAL FATHERS HAD GIVEN PERMISSION TO THE CARNIVAL TO OFFER THESE RIDES WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT A CONTRIBUTION WOULD BE LEFT FOR THE COMMUNITY. WHEN THE TIME CAME FOR THE CARNIVAL TO LEAVE, THERE WAS NOT ENOUGH MONEY LEFT FOR THE CONTRIBUTION AND CONSEQUENTLY, THE CAROUSEL WAS LEFT AS COLLATERAL FOR THE DEBT OWED. THE CARNIVAL NEVER RETURNED TO PAY THE DEBT AND COLLECT THEIR CAROUSEL. THUS, THE CAROUSEL REMAINS AT FIREMEN'S PARK WHERE IT WAS LEFT IN THE EARLY 1900'S. OVER THE YEARS. THE FAIR ASSOCIATION AND THE GIDDINGS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT HAVE REMAINED DILIGENT WITH THE MAINTENANCE AND RESTORATION OF THE CAROUSEL. IN 2004, THE CAROUSEL IS STILL OPERATIONAL AND CONTINUES TO ENTERTAIN YOUNG AND OLD ALIKE.
